

# What's in Bloom



## *Punica granatum* (Pomegranate).

This very colorful Mediterranean native is a large shrub that typically requires full sun and dry, rich soil, and is usually not hardy in this area. Our Pomegranate has done well along the “short cut” path between the Mansion and the Greenhouses for several years.

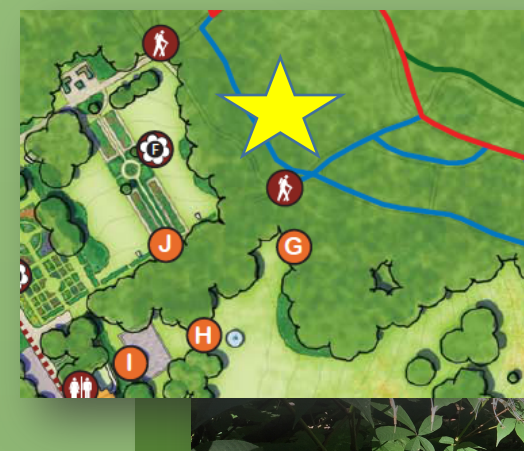
Where: Path between Mansion and Greenhouse



## *Echinacea pupurea* (Purple Coneflower).

This tough member of the Aster family is a Long-blooming perennial, growing well in a variety of soils and conditions, tolerating full sun to part shade, moist to dry soil. Re-blooms if dead-headed.

Where: Rain Garden and Mansion Circle



## *Aesculus parviflora* (Bottlebrush Buckeye).

Striking plumes of white flowers on this large deciduous shrub emerge in late June/early July and last for several weeks. It blooms well in full shade (but not in full sun), resists deer and rabbits, tolerates wet soil, and brightens the darkest corners of a shade garden.

## *Hydrangea arborescens 'Annabelle'* (Smooth Hydrangea).

These long blooming rounded white Hydrangeas are native to the Eastern United States and manage our climate well. Easy to grow, they tolerate a wide range of soil conditions and bloom well in shade; in more sun, they need more irrigation.

Where: Ryer Garden



## *Magnolia grandiflora* (Southern Magnolia).

This large evergreen tree is one of the finest natives of the Southeastern United States. Its large showy flowers and shiny evergreen leaves make it a year-round favorite, with the foliage appearing in holiday arrangements.
