Awaken to Nature

Students engage and connect deeply with nature through games, observations, exploration, and reflection.

Habitats and Biodiversity

What do plants and animals need to survive? Explore the forest, stream, and gardens in search of plants and animals and discover clues about their habitats.

Pollinators

Students will explore the relationship between our amazing pollinators and their favorite plants at Cylburn. We will play interactive games and observe bees and butterflies in our gardens and woodland and learn about the important role they play!



Trees

Trees are all around us, but what makes them so special? Students will get up close with our tremendous trees and explore their role at Cylburn and in our world.

Watersheds

Where does water go when it rains? Students will explore concepts of the water cycle and watersheds as they follow the path of water as it falls on our woodland paths, gardens, parking lots, and streams.



Naturalist-Led Programs

Led by Cylburn naturalists, these inquiry-based programs begin at 10 am and last approximately 2 hours. Programs are designed to accommodate grades K-8 and align with the Next Generation Science Standards (NGSS). Trips are offered in Fall and Spring. Field trips fees are \$200 per class, Baltimore City Public Schools are \$100 per class.
